Through virtual, community-based, and on-site programs at their Autism Hub, located in the heart of Bowmanville, Ontario, they are building a community for the often-overlooked adults still living at home with family caregivers.

Hollylynn Towie Memorial Fund was established in honour of a remarkable young autistic woman. Known for her warm heart and fierce loyalty as a friend, Hollylynn had a dream of pursuing a career in cosmetology. Tragically, on April 29th, 2012, Hollylynn's life was cut short in a devastating house fire in Whitby, where she passed away alongside her two best friends. In the wake of this unimaginable loss, Hollylynn's family channeled their grief into action, dedicating themselves to honoring her memory by supporting others in the autism
