



BEHAVIOUR IS COMMUNICATION

SEAT - FUNCTIONS OF BEHAVIOUR

Non-speaking indviduals may communicateby using behaviours, such as: vocalizations (giggle, yell, squeal);

movements (pace, rock, jump, flap or tap hands, fingers or feet); or externally-focussed actions (hit, shove, bite, stomp or overturn an item). Think about the intention of the behaviour. What is the goal for them?

SENSORY

 for pleasure, to self-regulate (sensitize or desensitize) or to soothe discomfort by stimming.

Accept stimming without judgement or mirror the stim to engage with the individual.

ATTENTION

 to direct your focus, seek your feedback or response, whether positive or negative

Reward attempts to connect with prompt, positive attention after behaviour stops. Proactively build time for individualized attention into your interactions. Ignore unwanted behaviours.

ESCAPE

 to avoid doing something; especially instructional or reciprocal

Reduce expectations around time and deliverables, consider a reward system, use task lists with completion steps and schedules that designate an escape time.

TANGIBLE

 to gain access to something they can't access independently. When trying to access a tangible item

To decode the ask - point, use gestures, offer suggestions, introduce augmentative communication tools. To redirect an ask, only if it can't be accommodated, offer alternative choices.
